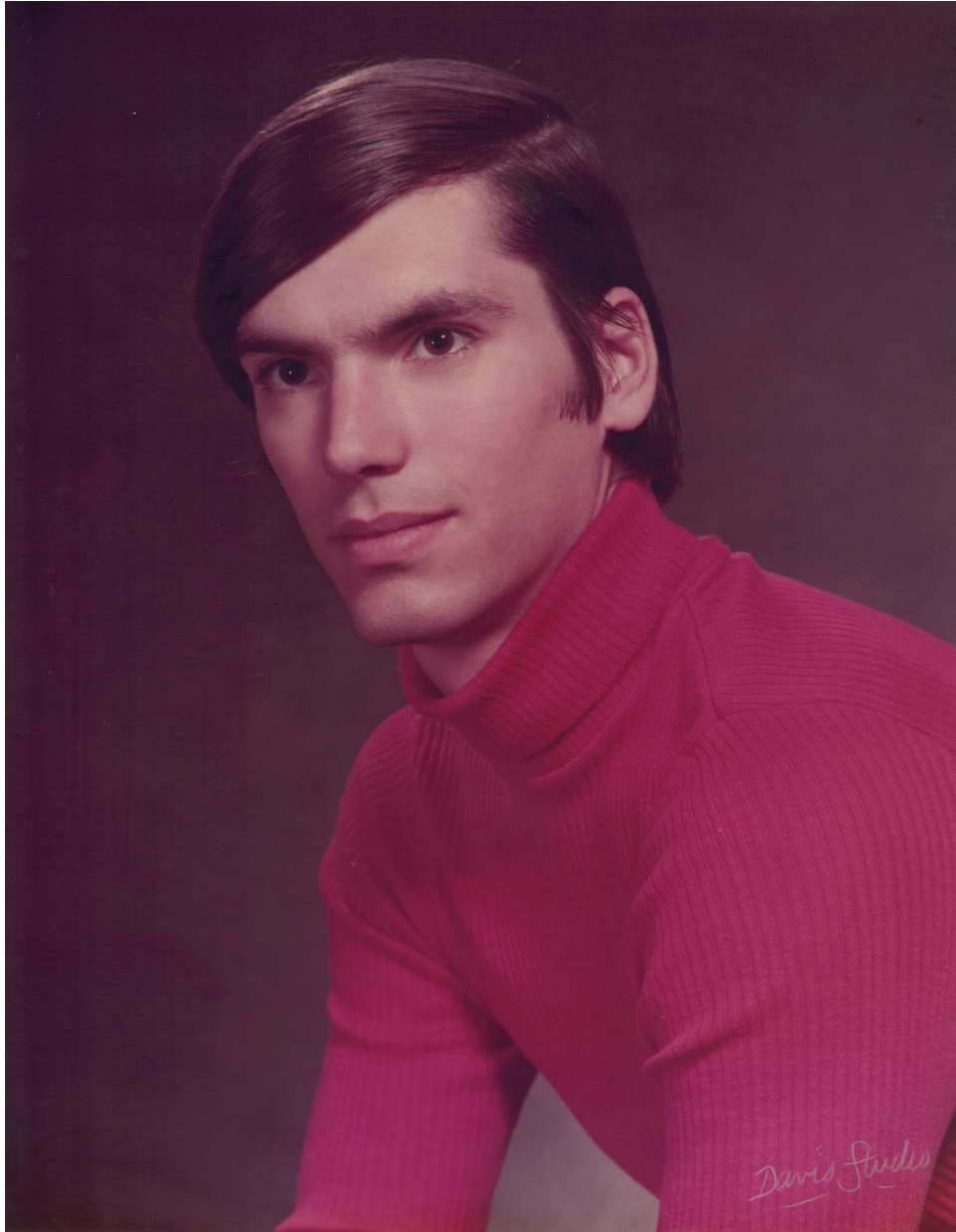

- People kept coming up with names
- Finally settled on Beastie
- Not a demon (an evil spirit) but rather a daemon (a deified being)

- Remuneration was cracking Phil's safe
- First appeared on a shirt printed by a family shop in Chicago

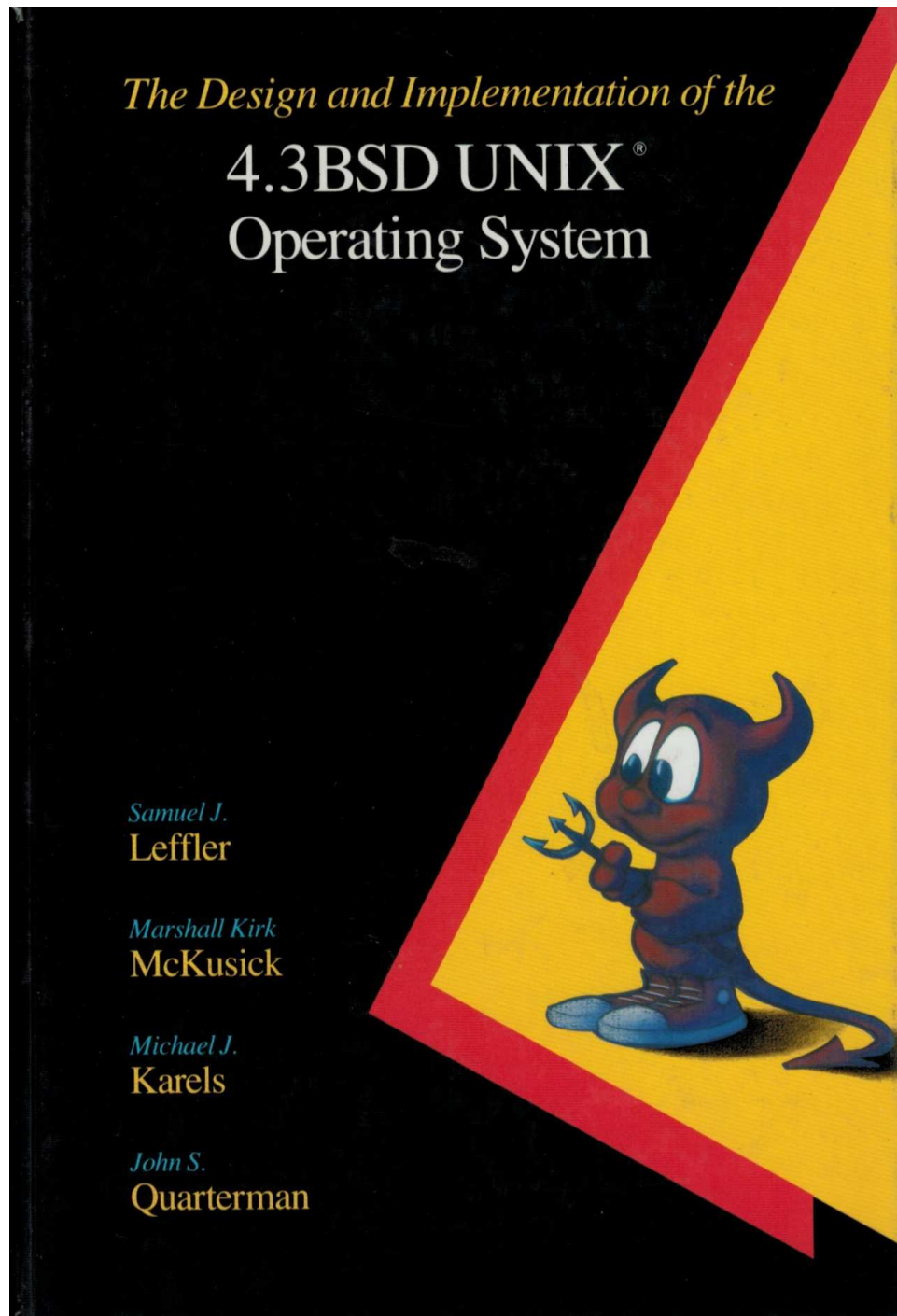

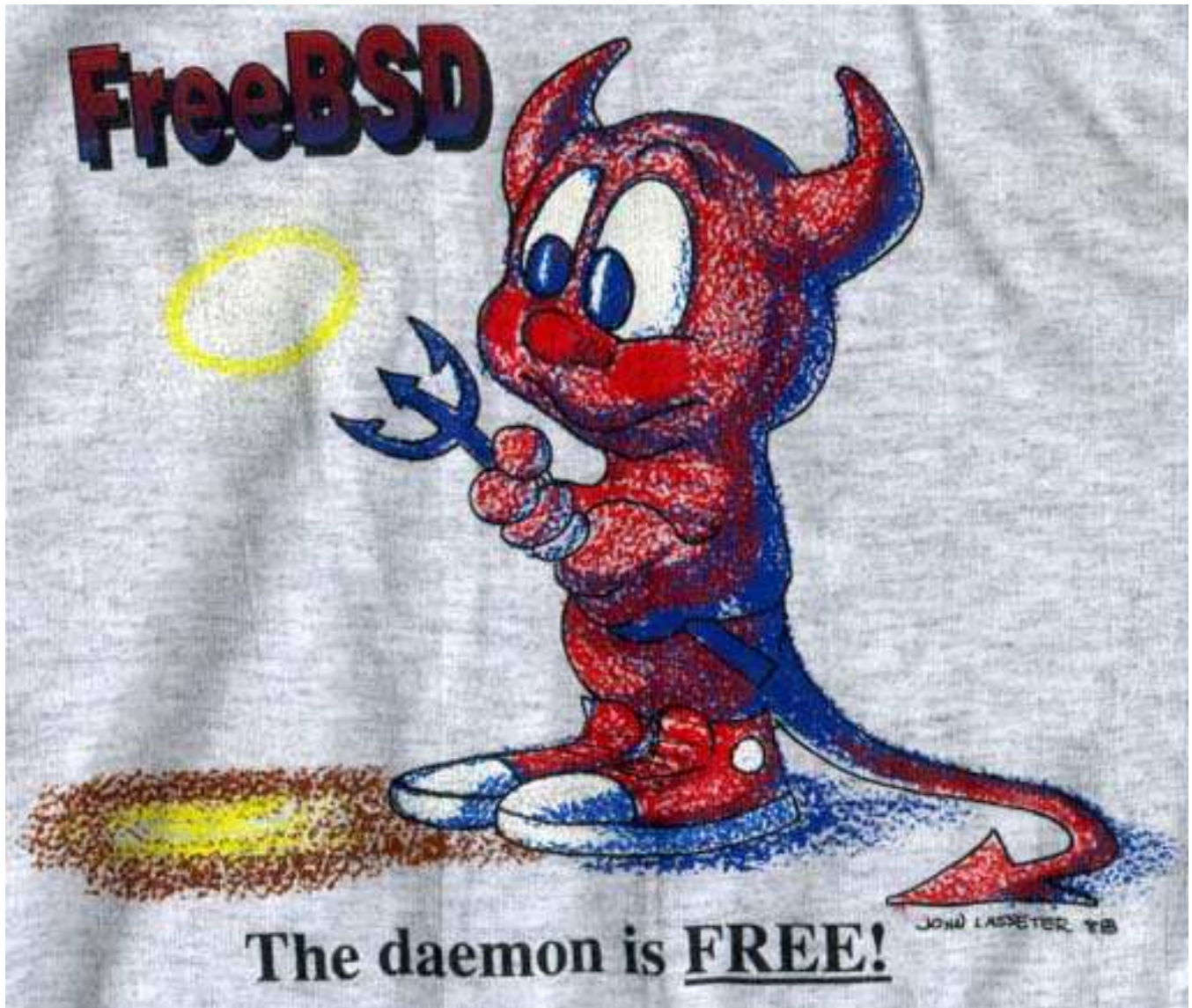

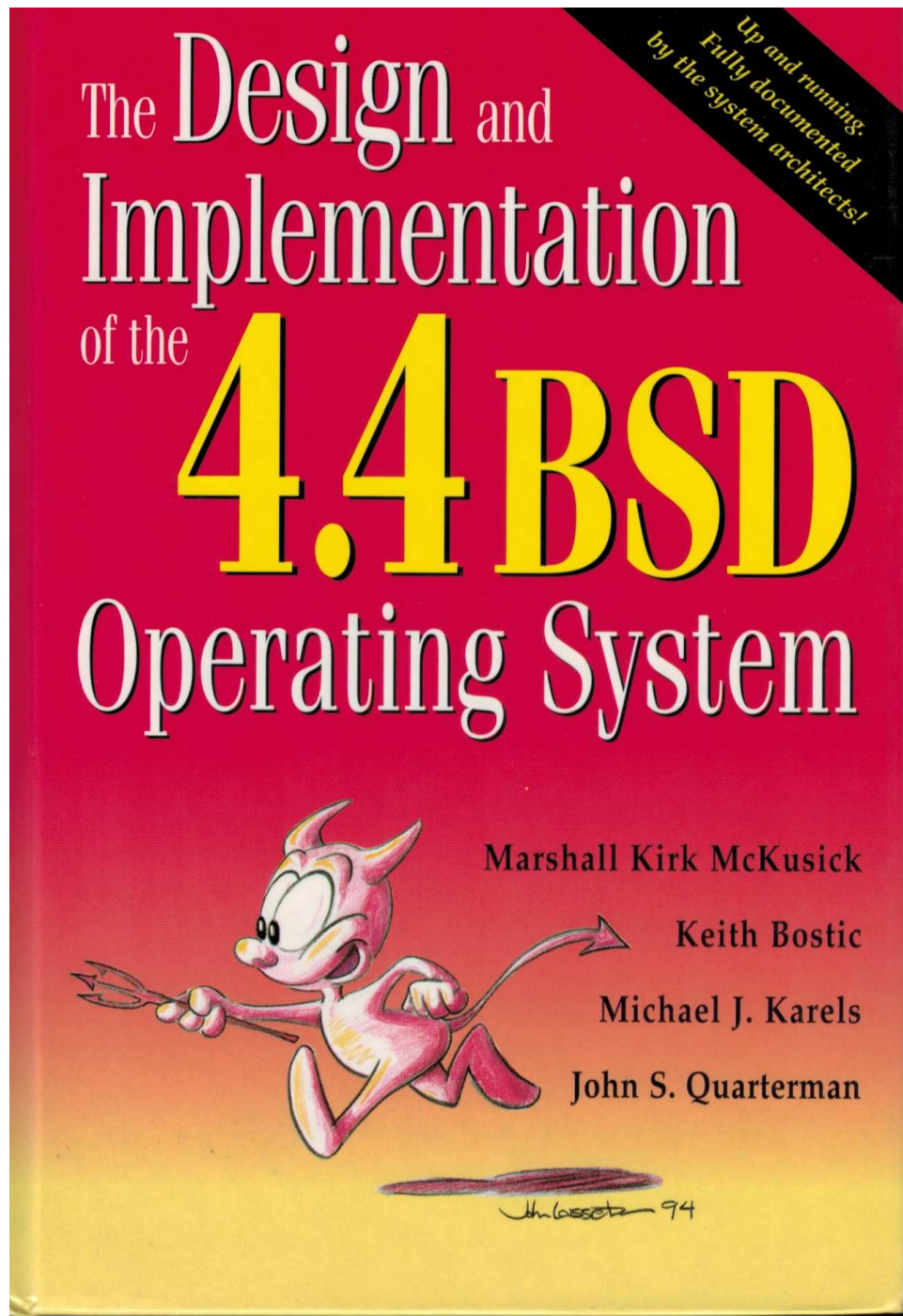

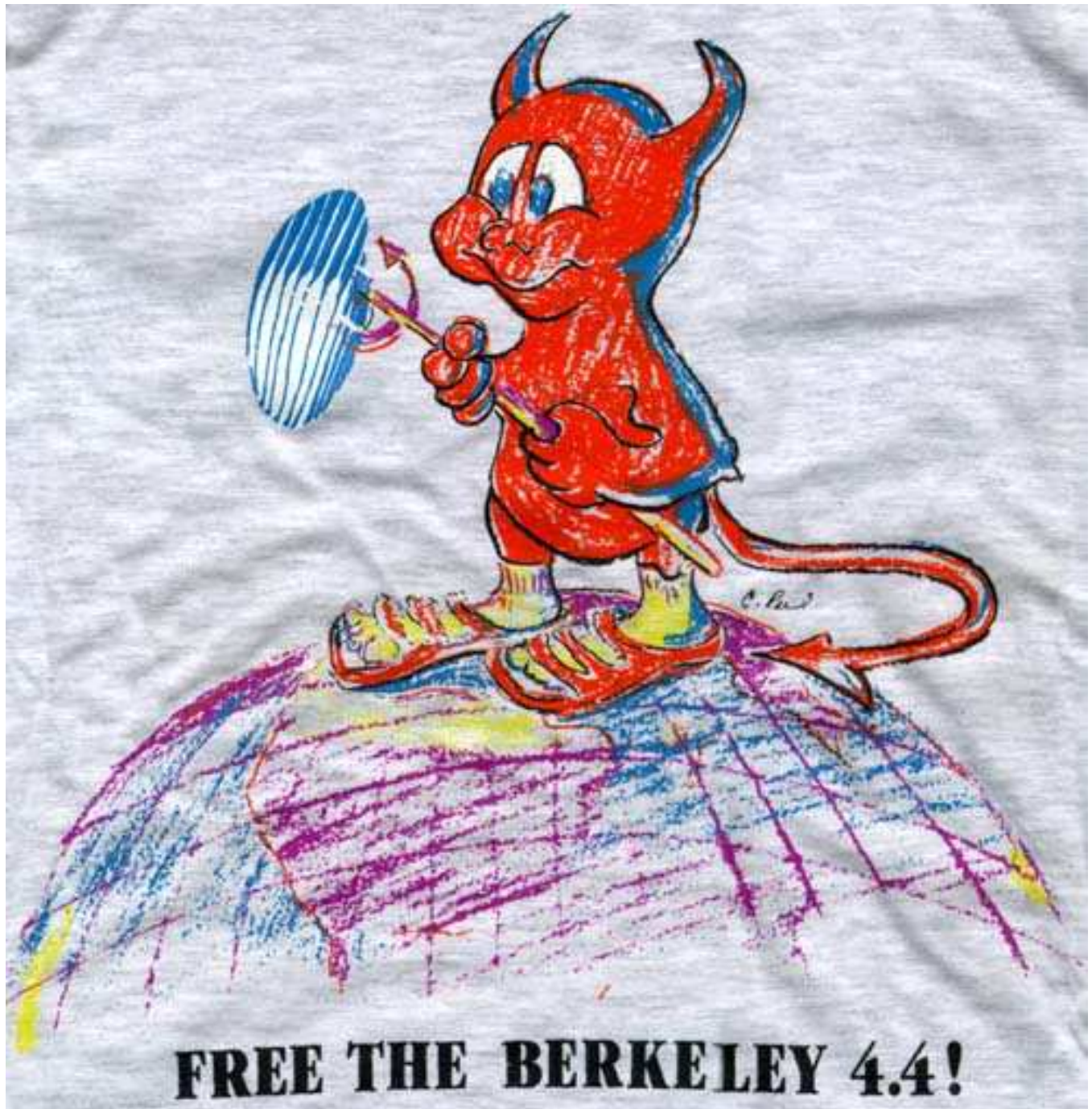

Dear John,

I am writing because I need your cooperation to ensure the proper use of the BSD Daemon character.

As you know, you drew images of the BSD Daemon periodically between 1984 and 1994. For example, you created the following three drawings:

- 1984 (black and white standing daemon used on the cover of the 4.2BSD and 4.3BSD manuals),
- 1988 (the colored chalk daemon used on the cover of the 4.3BSD textbook), and
- 1994 (the pen and ink running daemon used on the cover of the 4.4BSD textbook).

My understanding of our dealings in the past is that you have agreed that I am the owner of all intellectual property rights regarding the BSD Daemon and that you accepted payment for the drawings on that basis. Accordingly, for the past eleven years, I have held and asserted ownership of all BSD Daemon intellectual property rights. I have worked hard during this time to ensure that the BSD Daemon is used only to brand BSD-based hardware and software products and that they are used only by companies and individuals that truly sell or use BSD--based software. For example, I have insisted that companies using the BSD Daemon enter into license agreements with me.

In recent years, the use of the BSD Daemon has grown considerably, fueled by the ascent of Linux and a growing awareness of open source software in the business world. This increased popularity of BSD-based software (most notably FreeBSD, which now claims over two million users), requires that I take additional steps to ensure proper use of the BSD Daemon. I am also working with BSDi to market BSD software commercially. For these reasons, I would like to apply for a United States copyright registration of the BSD Daemon. I may also seek to trademark one or all of the three variants of the BSD Daemon that I mention above.


